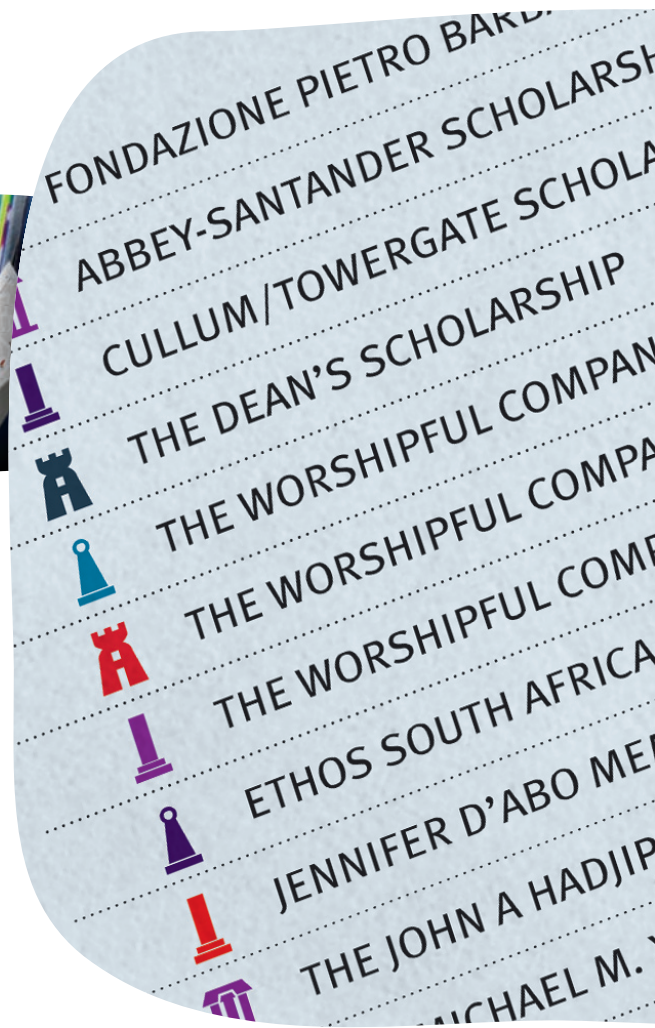




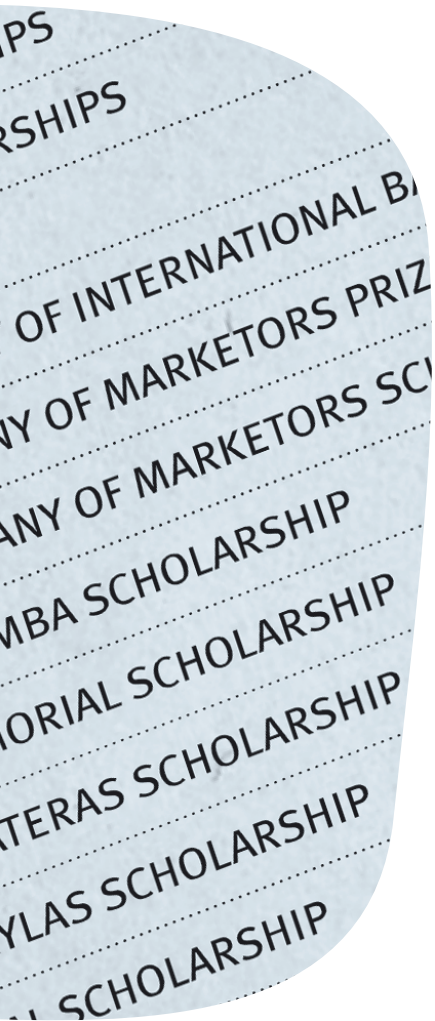

The new Matched Funding Scheme means that for every £300 donated, Cass could receive an extra £100 from the UK government.



Supporting a scholarship or prize also offers the opportunity for you to name it after yourself or your organisation:

- £10,000+ each year to name an MBA or MSc scholarship
- £5,000+ each year for two years to name a part-time MSc or an EMBA scholarship
- £4,500+ each year to name an undergraduate scholarship (minimum three years commitment)
- £1,000 or more a year to name a prize.

(Full tuition fees range from £17,000 to £30,000)

Part-time scholarships for part-time students

We now offer donors the chance to provide named scholarships in support of part-time students. These scholarships provide vital support for students who feel the pressure of balancing home life and responsibilities at work with a programme of study. Some students are at the beginning of their careers and therefore not yet commanding salaries large enough to support their studies and living expenses. They may also still be paying off undergraduate loans.

Sir John Cass's Foundation

The Foundation has supported education in London since Sir John Cass set up a school in Aldgate in 1710. He was born in the City of London in 1661 and served as MP for the City. He was knighted in 1713.

In May 2001, the Foundation made a generous donation to the Business School's new building project and continues to provide ongoing support to the Business School.
